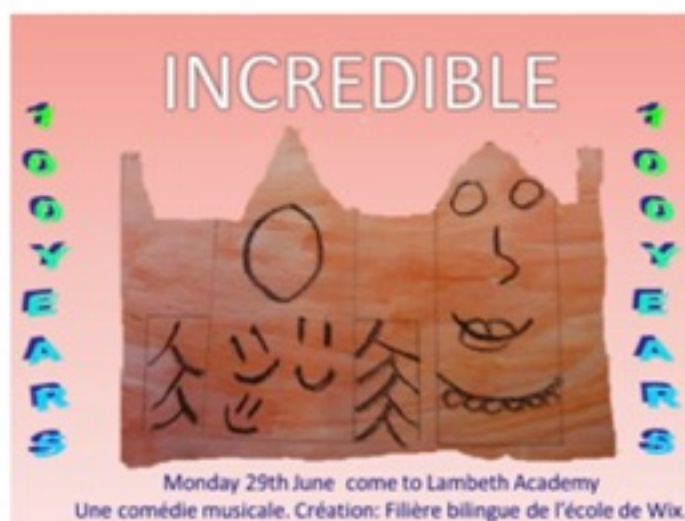

# Cooking

## Classic Sponge Cake L.M

### Ingredients:

115g of self raising flour  
1 level tsp of baking powder  
115g of spreadable butter  
115g of golden caster sugar  
2 large eggs  
1 teaspoon of vanilla extract

### For the filling and topping:

Strawberry jam, lemon curd...

### Icing sugar

Two 18cm by 4cm sponge tins, lightly buttered and bases lined, plus two wire cooling trays.

### Recipe:

1. Pre heat the oven to 170c, gas mark 3
2. All you do is sift the flour and the baking powder into a roomy mixing bowl, lifting the sieve quite high to give the flour a good airing as it goes down
3. Then, simply add all the other main ingredients. Now using an electric hand whisk, combine them for about one minute until you have a smooth creamy consistency.
4. Next divide the mixture between the two prepared tins, level off using the back of a tablespoon, and bake near the centre of the oven for about 25 minutes. The cakes are ready if when you press lightly with your little finger and the centre springs back.
5. Remove from the oven and after about 30 seconds loosen the edges by slitting a palette knife all around then turn them round onto a wire cooling tray. Now carefully peel back the lining by pulling it back. Lightly place the other cooling tray on top and just flip them over so that the tops are facing upwards.
6. When cool, sandwich them together with t your choice of preserves, with or without fresh whipped cream. For a final flourish, dust the whole cake with icing sugar.



## Custard L.Y

### Ingredients:

570ml of milk  
55ml of single cream  
half a tsp of vanilla extract  
4 eggs, yolk only  
30g of caster sugar  
2 level tsp of cornflour

### Recipe:

1. Bring the milk and cream to simmer over a low heat.
2. Whisk the yolks, sugar and cornflour together in a bowl until well blended
3. Pour the hot milk and cream on to the eggs and sugar, whisking all the time
4. Return to the pan and add the vanilla. Starr gently over a low heat
5. Pour into a jug and serve at once.
